## PLEASE CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING :

At the Peggy Guggenheim Collection academic activities are a fundamental part of our mission and we value research as an important strategic tool not only for our own development and growth but also for students' education. However, the museum's academic and human resources are made available only to those writing thesis that are considered to be important on the basis of the quality of research and innovation.

Due to the considerable number of requests that the museum receives, the Peggy Guggenheim Collection reserves the right to chose theses submitted, taking into consideration the likelihood of completion of the thesis, interests vested in the research and the level of involvement required from the museum staff.

Not all submitted requests can be accepted. Thesis projects must be developed according to the following procedure:

- To avoid involving several members of staff and making more work for all involved, each thesis student will have a contact at the museum to whom they can direct all questions regarding their thesis. We therefore ask that students to approach this contact with any enquiries they have, without involving third parties.

- Queries and problems relating to the thesis topic, suggested theoreticians, the method of research or the development of analysis must be directed to the student's own thesis supervisor.

- Data collection, drafting of indexes and bibliography as well as editing of the text must be carried out independently by the student under the close supervision of their supervisor. The Peggy Guggenheim Collection reserves the right to view the text before printing, to indicate errors and, if necessary, make corrections to content that involves the museum directly.

- Viewing of the thesis archive and use of the library are by appointment only with the librarian:
